## **Biogas Financing**



In 2021, YRE succeeded in facilitating a matching fund for Puskopdit Jatra Miguna from the Rabo Foundation with a capital loan of up to **Rp 4.5 billion** aimed at increasing the productivity of members, especially members who have businesses in agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries, plantations, and biogas.

Meanwhile, in other places, YRE also helped the Sharia Savings and Loans Cooperative "Al-Roudloh" or commonly abbreviated as KSPPS Al-Roudloh to obtain a loan from LPDB-KUMKM amounting to Rp 2 billion intended for members who have businesses in the trade sector, agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries, and biogas.
